



IIT Bhubaneswar to host its first Hybrid convocation

IIT Bhubaneswar will celebrate its annual convocation on Wednesday in hybrid mode in which some students will participate in person while others will do it online. News Infosys founder N R Narayana Murthy will grace the occasion as the chief guest by virtual mode. Students in hybrid classrooms are given fixed seats which do not allow them to swap seats, lecture rooms are entirely open for ventilation.

IIT Bhubaneswar has also begun taking hybrid classes, with roughly 40% of students already attending offline classes. New Delhi: Indian Institute of Technology, Bhubaneswar, will celebrate its annual convocation on Wednesday in hybrid mode in which some students will participate in person while others will do it online due to the pandemic situation. Announcing this, the institute's director, Prof R V Raja Kumar, on Tuesday said Infosys founder N R Narayana Murthy will grace the occasion as the chief guest by virtual mode and address the convocation while Dr Rajendra Prasad Singh, Chairman of IIT Bhubaneswar's Board of Governors, will preside over the programme offline.

The IIT director will hand over the degrees to students. During the convocation, the institute will confer degrees on 559 students. IIT Bhubaneswar has also begun taking hybrid classes, with roughly 40% of students already attending offline classes. In a hybrid mode setup, students can attend both online and offline classes.

The newly constructed Pushpagiri Lecture Hall Complex (PLHC), which is outfitted with electronic equipment, hosts hybrid classes. Also Read - IOCL Admit Card 2021 released, know details here The PLHC was inaugurated on August 20 by Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, with the goal of allocating pupils in such a way that each classroom has less than half the number of students and complete social separation is maintained. Students in hybrid classrooms are given fixed seats that do not allow them to swap seats, lecture rooms are entirely open for ventilation, and students are given bicycles on campus to avoid using public transportation.
