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Educational applications have revolutionised the learning scene among students in various City colleges and institutes

Classrooms, educational applications are a big hit among students of various colleges and institutes in the City. Integration of technology in learning has helped them in better time management and reduced dependence on expensive tutorial classes. From subject specific notes, critical analysis to interaction with teachers on digital platforms, these applications provide a wide variety of learning solutions to students of various streams. Not just that, some of the applications also help students in searching for specified courses in different universities and check their eligibility. *The City Express* interacted with students of various institutes to bring you which are the most popular learning applications in Bhubaneswar.

Applications like Marrow and Prepladder are popular among medical students in the City. According to reports, most MBBS students aspiring to crack NEET used to spend around ₹1 to ₹1.5 lakh for three year tutorial courses. "Such tutorial classes are not affordable for all. It is much more convenient for us to download and subscribe the applications, which charge around ₹36,000 and contains various features catering to our subject needs. These applications also stream lectures by prominent authors of medical books. By paying another ₹4,000, you can also download handwritten notes," said Chinmay, a medi-

The dependence on websites or applications for learning is higher among engineering and computer science students. For instance, in a batch of 60 computer science engineering students at IIIT Bhubaneswar, at least 35 students browse through various programming-teaching websites at least once in two days or have subscribed to YouTube channels. "One of the most popular website that the computer science students logon to on our campus is geeksforgeeks. It also offers various short term courses and internship opportunities. Be it core subjects or a specific coding language, you get notes for all segments. The website hosts notes for GATE, coding quizzes and puzzles," said Abhishek Anmol, a computer science student. Abhishek and his friends have also subscribed to YouTube channels like knowledgegate and javatpoint.
