

IIT Bhubaneswar conducts massive plantation drive at primary schools across the Khudupur, Podapoda and Kansapada villages as part of unnat bharat abhiyan

Bhubaneswar: Horticulture Department along with National Service scheme (NSS) team, IIT Bhubaneswar under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) conducted a plantation drive across all the primary schools of Khudupur, Podapoda, Kansapada villages in association with Youth Booth, a group of youth volunteers. Khudupur, Podapoda, Kansapada are among the three of the six villages adopted by IIT Bhubaneswar under UBA. The saplings had been collected from Forest Department, Government of Odisha by Youth Booth.
