


## IIT Bhubaneswar gets 20th rank in QS India University ranking

The Indian <u>Institute</u> of Technology Bhubaneswar has been ranked at the 20th position in the <u>Quacquarelli Symonds</u> (QS) <u>India</u> University Rankings, 2020, a top official of the institute said on Wednesday. The <u>Quacquarelli Symonds</u> (QS) <u>India</u> University Rankings 2020 launched the first top 100 <u>Universities</u> of India. The IIT Bhubaneswar has been ranked at 20th position, improving from its previous position of 21st in the last ranking, the official said.

The <u>British</u> higher education <u>analysts</u> QS has ranked the <u>higher education institutions</u> in <u>India</u> on the basis of eight parameters which have different weightages. The eight parameters are academic reputation (30 per cent), employer reputation (20 per cent), <u>faculty</u> student ratio (20 per cent), <u>staff</u> with PhD (10 per cent), Papers per <u>faculty</u> (10 per cent, citation per paper (5per cent), international <u>faculty</u> (2.5 per cent) and international students (2.5 per cent).

IIT Bhubaneswar Director Prof R V Raja Kumar said the strategic initiatives taken by the institute in the recent times have not only fostered the development of the <u>Institute</u>, but also resulted in a significant rise in <u>Institutes</u> ranking performance, indicating that our plans are right and we are on the right track. "The vision of IIT Bhubaneswar is to be globally well respected for producing outstanding <u>graduates</u> and generating new knowledge. In order to fulfil this dream, we aim to figure among the top 50-100 best <u>Institutions</u> in the world, as soon as possible.

"We have been marching ahead and constantly striving to raise the standards of the operations of the <u>Institute</u> on all fronts such as quality of education including teaching, learning, research and <u>faculty</u> and scaling up the current infrastructure in this endeavour," said Kumar. The director said "We are happy about the ranking performance of the institute. However, a lot more needs to be done in the years to come".

As per <u>Times Higher Education</u> (THE) World University rankings 2020, the institute has been ranked 601-800 among 1,396 institutes across the world and 10th in <u>India</u> among 56 institutes, where it has been ranked 7th in citation scores in <u>India</u>, the director said..
