SCHOOLS CELEBRATE I-DAY VIRTUALLY

Bhubaneswar, August 16: The 74th Independence Day was observed by various educational institutes here virtually sans students Saturday.

Parades and cultural programmes, which have been common during I-Day celebrations in all schools, were not held due to the ongoing pandemic. Many students participated in the celebrations enthusiastically through online platforms like Facebook Live and Zoom.

The virtual celebration by SAI International School reflected the enthusiasm and positivity of the children even during the pandemic.
