IIT plans to raise seats

Bhubaneswar, Feb. 12: The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) here plans to increase its BTech seats for various streams from 260 to 350 from the next academic session.

The IIT authorities also plan to shift all their academic operations to their permanent campus at Argul from the coming session. In January last year, the institute started shifting some of its units to its permanent campus at Argul village on the outskirts of Bhubaneswar.

The IIT is also set to introduce a number of subjects from the next academic session at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

"Our focus is on contributing to the societal development with dedicated student and faculty engagements," said IIT Bhubaneswar director R.V. Raja Kumar, while speaking on the occasion of its 9th foundation day celebrations today.

Union minister Dharmendra Pradhan, who attended the event as the chief guest, gladly offered to be the "brand ambassador" of the institution to take it to greater heights.

"India, particularly the state of Odisha, with its culture richness and heritage, can surpass any country in the world if an institution, such as the IIT Bhubaneswar, takes up the challenge in pro-
