Born to a marginal farmer and his wife in Nandapur village of Koraput district, A bhish ek Babu didn't hear of engineering as a profession until he joined high school. As a child, he had seen his father ploughther plough-ing a tiny plot

to dream big. "He used to earn ₹70,000 per year by growing

seasonal vegetables. He seasonal vegetables. He didn't want me and my sister to compromise with education. Despite several difficulties, he managed to get us admitted to a convent school in SimpliGuda," he said. The next stop was Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, where his ambience expanded. While interacting with his seniors teracting with his seniors at the school, he learnt about the 'Super 30' pro-gramme conducted by Odi-sha Mining Corporation

sha Mining Corporation (OMC).
"I spent six hours a day to crack the OMC entrance. I was inducted into the coaching programme for 2017-2018," he said. As part of its CSR initiatives, OMC provides free coaching to students from underprivational programme for the coaching to students from underprivational coaching to the co leged families for a year to help them crack Advanced JEE entrance. The stu-dents are also provided with accommodation
